
A 132 YEAR TRADITION OF SPIRITUAL OUTREACH

IN THE BEAUTIFUL, INSPIRING MOUNTAINS OF PARK CITY, UTAH



In the early 1960's, after the decline of mining all but created a ghost town, a federal grant led to the development of its skiing industry at Deer Valley and Park City Mountain. The last 60 years have seen it grow into world famous status among the giants of the ski industry. It was the site of many 2002 Olympic Winter Games competition venues.

Our cultural environment is rich with the presence of the Sundance Film Festival, the Deer Valley summer concerts performed by the Utah Symphony and our historic Egyptian Theater, founded in 1926. We host the Kimball Art Center Park City Arts Festival in the summer that brings over 60,000 people to our small town. Located just 30 miles from Salt Lake International Airport, access to world class snow sports, mountain









biking, hiking, fly fishing, camping and National Parks are all within easy reach.

Today, the greater Park City community of 25,000 residents boasts one of Utah's finest school districts and a highly educated population. With an easy commute, many Park City locals choose to frequent Salt Lake City, giving them access to work and culture. The University of Utah is nestled against the Wasatch Front, offering top tier education, hospital, PAC 10 athletics, and many teaching jobs, including the Huntsman Cancer Institute. The Utah Jazz calls Salt Lake home, along with our renowned Utah Symphony and many wonderful museums and live entertainment opportunities.

St. Luke's Episcopal Church has been a part of the community since 1890, opening its doors to all seeking a place of spiritual grounding





and refuge from the pressures and trials of life. We are seeking a rector who will provide spiritual guidance through an ever changing society during this time of uncertainty and anxiety. Our congregation is a joyous and hopeful one aware of our challenges and opportunity for growth.

Each Sunday we perform similar services at our two worship sites: the unique historic chapel located in Old Town, Park City, houses approximately 15-20 people for our Sunday 7:45 A.M. said service. The main church is located 5 miles from Old Town and is the site of our Sunday 10:30 A.M. traditional worship service, which includes our Sunday School program. Our administrative offices are also housed at this location.

A FINANCIALLY SECURE CHURCH WITH NO DEBT

St Luke's has enjoyed a balanced budget for many years with income and expenses approximately \$370,000 annually. Contributions per household are approximately \$2,635.00. The Church has no debt on their buildings.

We are often blessed by special monetary gifts from our parishioners to fund special projects. We have a reserve fund which provides money for capital projects.

As in all churches, the pandemic decreased our collections, especially at the holidays when out of town visitors and second home owners attend our church. We are hopeful that we will return to pre-pandemic levels of giving. 10%

Greetings,

Having recently become the twelfth bishop of the Episcopal Diocese in Utah, I would like to invite you to consider joining us at this transitional time in our history. As a diocese, there is excitement and energy for engaging the work of *Becoming Beloved Community*, which includes the *Way of Love* practices, racial reconciliation, advocacy for the marginalized, and creation care. We will embark on the significant work of this new era by strengthening our Episcopal identity through work on congregational vitality and developing discipleship throughout the diocese.

The Episcopal Church in Utah is a minority religion in the state, but its congregations are comprised of many former Church of Latter Day Saints members. The work of strengthening Episcopal Identity, of becoming clear about, and continuing, the strong historical presence of Episcopalians in Utah will be our focus for the coming years. This work began in a new way in January of 2020 when the Diocese of Utah sent 100+ participants to the Rooted in Jesus conference. Our foundational work around identity is based on reviving the energy and excitement of those who attended the conference but were hindered upon return by COVID limitations. Now is the time!

As I consider the work I have been called to as the Bishop of this complex and wonderful diocese, the work of the early disciples comes to mind. The call in this era feels very much the same. In electing me, the diocese has called for a strong, inclusive, justice-oriented approach to ministry; it has called for a revival of discipleship. If you feel called to work, if you feel the Spirit stirring in your heart to empower and equip the people of God to be disciples in a world as complicated as the early Christians found themselves, then I encourage you to come amongst us and discern your call.
